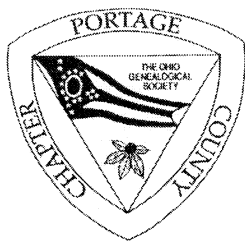

**HOW COME THEY DIDN'T LIVE?
BECAUSE THEY DIED AND WERE IN THE "WRONG" OCCUPATION**

One of the more perplexing situations a person may face in genealogical research is the cause of death and the occupation of an individual. Unless a death certificate is obtained, the information as to the cause of death or the person's occupation is generally unavailable through obituaries or death notices. The occupation may no longer be in existence, such as an elevator operator or the name of the occupation has been changed over the years. For instance a botcher now means cobbler or tailor. While knowing the cause of death and the name of the occupation may not be the most essential piece of information to genealogical research, the reason may be most fascinating and information to know. The facts also present a more complete and clearer picture of the individual and his working life.

The language of yesterday does not always match today's medical terms. Any number of websites are available to define archaic medical terms in today's words. The University of Cincinnati Library has compiled a list of medical conditions which should be helpful to the genealogist. It can be viewed at: <http://www.libraries.uc.edu/libraries/arb/archives/documents/medterms.pdf>. One extensive list that might be consulted is: <http://rmhh.co.uk/illness.html> from Great Britain. Another useful website is <http://www.thornber.net/medicine/html/medgloss.html>, which includes portions taken from Dr. Johnson's Dictionary first published in Great Britain in the middle of the 1700's. Information on archaic medical terms as well as number of medical issues from around the globe can be found at: <http://home.ptd.net/~NIKKI/medical.htm>. Websites may also offer current definitions of diseases and conditions in addition to the archaic terms. Another site for old time medical conditions and situations is Genealogy Quest at: <http://www.genealogy-quest.com/glossaries/diseases1.html>. A website dealing specifically with obsolete terms in the medical profession is: <http://www.rootsweb.com/~njmorris/disease.htm>.

Another dramatic change over the years has been the name of a person's occupation. Although an individual might be performing the same tasks or in the same job over the years, the name of the position may have changed from its original name. The website: <http://rmhh.co.uk/occup/i-k.html> lists occupations which may be unfamiliar to present day researchers. By using any search engine and typing in the words "obsolete occupations," the result will produce any number of lists of "old" vocations. Olive Tree Genealogy is one such list at <http://olivetreegenealogy.com/misc/occupations.shtml> and also has many other helpful lists. Genwriters has a collection of websites sites dealing with past occupations at: <http://www.genwriters.com/work.html>. Numerous such lists will display terms which are used today; however, many will be unfamiliar in today's vocabulary. For example, a catchpole means a sheriff's officer, especially one who arrests debtors and a cooper is defined as one who makes repairs to vessels made of staves and hoops, such as casks, barrels, tubs, etc. are two instances.

Understanding the occupational and medical subject terms can help us to understand how our ancestors lived and died to present a fuller picture of their lives.

He has once or twice before knocked at death's door, but was permitted to return, as it were, to life and friends, but his physician, Dr. Johnson, thinks it impossible for him to rally from this attack. But no one, it would seem, could be nearer ready than he, for the change.

Later.—We learn that Elder White died on Wednesday night, and the funeral takes place this morning at 10 o'clock, at his late residence, the corpse to be brought to Ravenna for interment.

ANOTHER OF OUR PIONEERS GONE.—Sabbath morning, Dec. 11th, Mr. Jesse S. Shepard died in the 77th year of his age. He came to Freedom in 1835, consequently has lived here for 46 years. Mr. Shepard will be missed by the people of Freedom as much as any man in the township. He was one of the quiet men, never getting into any difficulty with any one. Honest to a fault he leaves a name behind which is above rubies. In all his 46 years here it is not believed he ever had an enemy. His first wife died in 1862. He afterwards married a sister of Deac. Loomis of Charlestown, who survives him, and an only child, Mrs. N. A. Curtis. His neighbors all feel bereaved, and especially your correspondent. We had lived together and near to each other for fifty-six years, and in all that time never a hard word between us. He was truly like Nathaniel of old—"a man in whom was no guile." His funeral was attended by a large number of the people. Rev. Mr. Torrey preached the sermon.

By request of Miss Louisa Almon a few of her young associates and personal friends assembled at the residence of her father, Jacob Almon, on Vine street, on Wednesday evening, where she is lying sick, of consumption, to hold a prayer meeting. It is perhaps the last meeting of the kind, with her; her wasting form and wasting strength indicate that the next meeting with her will be a praise meeting, lasting through eternity. The sad farewell was deprived of its greatest sting by the assurance all felt that her sweet disposition and faithful, christian life would be rewarded by an "abundant entrance" into the eternal city.

Charlestown.

FIRE.—This community has again been startled by the cry of fire. About daybreak the morning of Oct. 23th, the barn of Thomas and Julian King was discovered to be on fire. The flames spread so rapidly there was only time to loose the two horses and four cows from the stable underneath the barn, which with its contents, was soon consumed. The granary was also burnt and the dwelling only saved by the faithful and determined working of neighbors. The fire was "overhead" in the barn when first seen, and its origin unknown. A door that was kept fastened on the inside was found open, indicating that some one had been there. The loss is partially covered by an insurance of \$600.00.
