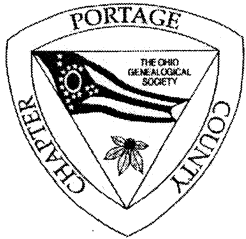


# Portage Path to Genealogy

**Award Winner:**

The Ohio Genealogical Society's Fellows & Awards Committee announced at the annual conference that the Portage County Historical Society won the Oliver Hazard Perry Award for best Ohio related military historical record. Jacqueline Weaver **Woodring** edited the work, **1861-1864 Civil War Letters of General Erastus Barnard Tyler**. The publication consists of 120 letters written by Tyler while he was commanding the 7<sup>th</sup> Ohio Volunteer Infantry to his brother-in-law Newell D. Clark in Ravenna, Ohio. The book includes information about his family and follows him after the war until his death.

A First Settler would include anyone who settled in present day Portage County by December 31, 1840. We have about fifty members of the chapter who have proved their early ancestors.

From a Ravenna newspaper –October 31, 1907

Listed under Court News:

**THREE WILLS.**

**Last Testiments of Cyrus Turnbull, Fredrick B. Freeman and Thomas Fahey. 10-31-1907**

By the will of the late Cyrus Turnbull, executed on February 19, 1901, he directed that his estate, real and personal, after payment to those who cared for him during his old age, he divided equally among his four children, Lily Gilbert, Elizabeth A. Buckley, William E. Turnbull and Celestia M. Turnbull. By a codicil executed on June 29, 1901, he recites the fact that he had sold his farm and thus changed the course of descent as to that portion of his property. He also directed that his son, being in feeble health, have only a life use of the one-fourth part bequeathed to him and at his death one-third of his share to go to his daughter Mary and the remainder to be divided among his other children or their heirs. In codicil No. 2 he recites the death of his son and "for reasons sufficient to myself" changed the will and codicil as to his granddaughter May by fixing her share at \$500 to be paid to her when she is 20 years old, with Henry W. Gilbert as trustee.

The will of Frederick B. Freeman of Hiram, executed on October 18, 1906, bequeathes all of his property of every kind to his wife, Abbie Mowery Freeman, without inventory and without bond.

The will of Thomas Fahey, late of Ravenna, gives to the incumbent priest of the Ravenna church of the Immaculate Conception the sum of \$25, "trusting that he says as many masses for the repose of my soul and the soul of my wife," \$50 is to go for a tombstone on a lot to be chosen by said priest in St. Mary's cemetery and the remainder of the property is to go to his wife Margaret during her life time, with power of executor to sell any or all of it for her support. What is left after her death, if any, goes to the church. J. H. Dussel is named as executor without bond.

There are two kinds of curiosity-- one leads to knowledge; the other to regrets. 2-7-1923

Below items from *Garrettsville Journal* November 8, 1906

Henry H. Webb, polisher at the Buckeye chair factory, returned to work last week after an enforced vacation of one week by reason of injuries sustained by a barrel of cider which fell on one of his legs. His attending physician told him that he had six cases of broken legs caused in the same manner.

Mrs. S. E. Nichols and son, W. W. Nichols, left on Wednesday night of last week for Deer River, Minn., where they will remain for about a month. Mr. Nichols, who is night operator at the Erie, will spend his entire vacation of thirty days hunting deer.

Mike Gado, about 45 years old, a Hungarian, was picked up by Randolph farmers at Johnnycake Hollow Friday evening and brought to Ravenna jail. It is believed that he is an escaped inmate from some asylum, probably near Columbus, judging from the few utterances he has made. At times he is aboard ship, pulling rope, setting sails and doing the various duties of a Jack tar. He speaks of wife and children, sometimes at Washington, D. C., and sometimes in Washington county. Judge Rockwell viewed him in prison and will probably take further investigation into his sanity and identity.

The \$25 offered by E. W. Hatfield of Charlestown for the return of his stolen horse and the \$25 offered by the county commissioners for the arrest and conviction of the thief has been distributed by paying \$12.50 of it to Lawrence O. Burkett of Alliance and forwarding the remainder to the chief of police at Alliance for distribution as he shall deem just between the three Alliance officers instrumental in making the capture.

Robert McDonald, 24 years old, late of Painesville, a Baltimore & Ohio switchman, was arrested on a charge of vagrancy Friday evening by Officer Hotchkiss. He gave evidence of mental derangement and since his arrest has become much worse. He imagines at times that he is being pursued by assassins who are trying to catch him to cut off his head. Judge Rockwell will hold an inquest of lunacy.

You totter onward with your load.

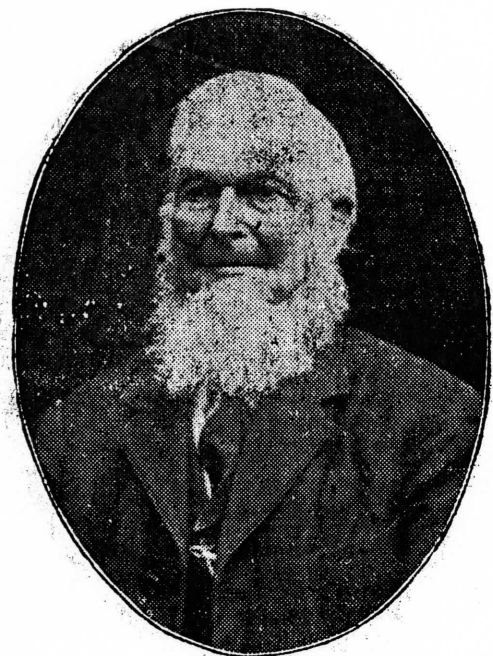
We envy you, with old age blest,

If he is blown up by his wife. If he runs for office. If he dies in liquor. If he dyes his hair. If he is caught lying west of the twenty-first meridian of longitude from Washington.
