The following is from the <u>Transactions of the Evangelical Protestant Trinity Church</u>. (Part One of this book was in the April- May, Vol. 33 No. 3 issue of this newsletter) The church was first located in Lexington Twp. Stark County Ohio in 1836-1850 and then at the corner of County Line Road & Porter-Shilliday Road, in Atwater Twp. Portage County from 1850-1915. Original records were in German & translated by Mr. Joseph Maier of Tallmadge, Ohio, Mr. Leon C. W. Kettering of Toledo compiled the book in 1952 from the transcribed church record books. All dates listed refer to the 1800's for the Baptisms, Marriages & Deaths.


The book following the last birth entry for 1889 has apparently been lost. The books preceding and following the record of marriages have been lost.

AN ACCOUNT BOOK NOW OF EARLY TIMES.

Records Made Many Years Before the Revolutionary War-Book Owned By Davis Brothers Kent.

The following are a few items of interest taken from an old account book. This book was owned by an early Connecticut man and has descended through his family to the present time. The book says the original owner died in '1811. The book is with raw sheepskin or thick parchment of rawhide color. It is 6½ by 1½ inches and of heavy rag paper. It was used by all the owners and decendants as an account book sold contains some curious entries as

April 13, 1740, Captain Joseph Clark dr. to two days plowing 12 shillings. 1751 ye widow Rachel Sanford dr.

To a pair of shoes 2s 8d.

To mending a pair for Joseph 12d. To mending a pair for Eunice 10d. To mending a pair for David 10d. To mending pair for hirself 2s.

These accounts continue on for a long time for cobbling and farm work. September the 26, 1770, then reckoned with A. Durand and due to me seven pounds fifteen shillings all witness our hands. The names of the two follow:

1776 to mending pair shoes for Lib

May, 1806, Tesse Hodge to 9 pounds of flax and a half 8 shillings.

To 2 shad 1s 4d. May 2, 1808, to one fish 4d. February 27, 1801, to one day's work dressing flax 6s.

1811, to half day work January 1, 18 outting wood 3s.

To one day husking corn 4s. To one day butchering 4s.

In 1812 almost all entries were for cutting wood and dressing flax.

1813 to one day's work picking corn

It seems to have been but little used from this to 1830 when the owner hegan running an inn or tavern in Ohio when are found the following entries:

October 4, 1830, P. Achison dr. to one jill whiskey 8c.

A. Clinton dr. to two gallons whis-

key 64c. To two drinks (note the reduction at wholesale) 4c.

John Wedin cr. by bushel oats 15c. Jonah Hanes cr. by 1 pound tee \$1.

To bushel peaches \$1 25. Dr. to 8 pounds veal 24c. To one jill whiskey 8c.

Leman Wilk cr. by 33 gallons whiskey \$6.65.

Dr. to two (empty bottles) 25c. Aaron Dodge dr. to quart whiskey

To one pint 61/4c.

Above prices for liquor were where buyer furnished bottle or jug.

January 2, 1832. Hiram Shill dr. to gill rum 61/40. E. Smith dr. to bottle bitters 121/20. Do to 4 meals 75c.

Do to gallon whiskey 371/20. D. Daniel cr. by one 24 light sash

\$1.50. Janes Mills cr. by two sides leather one mine and one his \$2.50.

D. Wishel dr. to one drink whiskey

614c.
This was perhaps two glasses at one time and remains unpaid.
David Elmore to one drink gin 614c. Jerry Marshall dr. to \$4. He agrees to bring me a barrel of whiskey turn my account before this near three dollars and I to give him 50 cents more cash when barrel is delivered the balance to be paid out at the bar the whiskey to be 22 cents per gallon.

This book continues on in similar manner until 1840 when it was filled full and laid aside. The wording and spelling of the entries have been faithfully copied. Many of the entries the entries have been faithfully copied. tries for drinks, pints, quarts and gallons remain unpaid.
