A Prominent Citizen Gone.

George Robinson, for forty-seven years a resident of Ravenna, died Wednesday, July 12, 1882, at his residence East Main-st, after a protracted illness, in the 81st year of his age.

Mr. Robinson was born at Lancaster, Penn. November 21, 1801, of Scotch-Irish parentage, and of a family of thirteen children, he was the last survivor. His father died when his son was eighteen years of age, and, seeing a large family dependent upon a widowed mother, the young lad started out into the world, with but a solitary five franc piece in money, with but a limited education. but, with almost boundless energy and a will to succeed, he went forward. For one year he worked upon a farm, earning sufficient money to pay his school tuition for two years, he earning his board by labor out of school hours. This done, he had to adopt some life-work, and decided to acquire the trade of a carpenter. When about completing his apprenticeship, he fell from a building, breaking one of his legs, upon which he was unable to walk for two years. This incident or accident, changed the whole tenor of his after life, but the two years of enforced confinement were by no means lost, as he continued his studies, perfecting himself particularly in mathematics. His sister, the late Mrs. Margaret Williamson, with whom at that time he made his home, has related this incident, which is illustrative of his persistent energy and mental application.

"George," said the late Mrs. W., "had been working several days on a difficult mathematical problem, without succeeding in solving it. One night about midnight, he aroused the family, calling for a light, and slate and pencil, as he could then solve the stubborn problem. Being himself unable to hold either light or slate, he had to ask his sister and her husband to do that, and then in a rapid manner, he quickly covered both sides of the slate with figures, and writing the answer at the bottom of one side, he said, 'there it is,' and turned over and went to sleep."

After his recovery, he continued his studies, teaching school winters, until he could obtain a position in his chosen profession of civil engin. eering, which he did in the year 1828, beginning at the lower round of the ladder, and climbing upward, to the topmost point of the profession. In 1830 he became assistant engineer on the Ohio Canal, and so remained until its completion, and then, in 1835, accepted a similar position on the Pennsylvania and Ohio Canal, and made his headquarters at Ravenna. (where he ever afterward resided) soon being promoted to Chief Engineer, which position he held until 1845, when he retired from the canal. In the last named year he entered upon the surveys for the Cleveland and Pittsburg Railroad, and soon became its Chief Engineer, and when the read was ready for operation became its first Superintendent. In 1853 he left the C. & P. R. R. to accept the chief engineership of the Cleveland and Mahoning Railroad, and remained as Chief Engineer and Superintendent until 1865, when he permanently retired from the construction and management of public after a period of service of thirty-six years. In this period he had in charge thirty-six other engineering works, but those mentioned were the most important, or prominent of his un. dertakings.

In 1854, in association with the Messrs. Robert, John B. and Eli P. King, he established the Banking House of Robinson, King & Co., which con. tinued business until 1864, when the Second National Bank of Ravenna was organized and Mr. Robinson became its first President, and occupied that position until his voluntary retirement a few years since, though he remained in the directory of the bank up to his death. In 1863, in company with D. C. Coolman, he established the Diamond Window Glass manufactory, and engaged actively in its management until 1879, when he sold his interest and retired from all active business.

July 26, 1831 he married Louisa M. Johnson at Lancaster, Ohio, who now survives him, with six of their seven children: Capt. A. K, Robinson, Mrs. T. F. Wildes, Miss Frances H. Robinson Mrs. H. W. Riddle, Geo. F. Robinson, Esq., Mrs. M. Adelaide Smith, all of whom with the exception of Mrs. Wildes, are residents of Ravenna, Mrs. Wildes residing in the neighboring city of Akron. The three sons of Mr. and Mrs. Robinson entered the Union Army, and their second son, Lieut. W. H. Robinson of the 7th Ohio Infantry, died in the service in 1861, the first Ravenna soldier who was cut down by death. Eleven grand-children and one great-grand-child, conclude the family tree.

Mr. Robinson, was essentially a self-made man He attained and occupied a high position in his profession, and in other walks of life. In the year 1842, Mr. Robinson made a profession of religion, and under the pastorate of Rev. L. D. Mix united with the Ravenna Methodist church, ever continuing a valued member, and a consistent, christian gentleman, May, 19, 1852, he became a member of Ravenna Lodge No. 65, I. O. O. F.
The juneral of Mr. Robinson took place at 2 p.

m., Friday, July 14th, from his late residence, and was under the auspices of Ravenna Lodge No. 65, I. O. O. F., who designated Messrs. H. Y. Beebe, F. W. Coffin, Wm. Ward, D.N. Furry, D.C. Coolman. W. Holcomb, pall-bearers. At the house the religous services were conducted by Rev. John Tribby, and Rev. R. F. Randolph assisted by a male quartet of singers. The rites of the Order were performed at Maple Grove Cemetery, by Rev-Andrew Willson, Chaplain of Ravenna Lodge.

A number of the employes of the Diamond Glas, Works attended the funeral of Mr. Robinson in a body to attest their profound respect for their former employer, and the First National Bank and Banking House of E. S. Comstock were closed during the funeral hours, as a token of respect for their deceased business conferree.

This rapid glance at the life of one of Ravenna's oldest citizens, is, of necessity brief, but still it is a tribute to one whose worth during the long period of his activities was sincerely respected. To his family and immediate circle of friends he leaves the rich legacy of a most honorable fame, and there can come no fleck to disturb the memories of one who was a pure citizen, and with all manli. ness filled his place in the world,
